Dan Johnson from the University of Lethbridge reported this week...

I have stopped at a few pulses fields and made casual observations.

- I've noticed a very small amount of feeding by the two-striped, Packard's and migratory grasshopper. Several other species are in the fields but do not seem to be feeding.
- I have seen a few wireworms, leafhoppers and weevils, but very few. Some leafhoppers, seedbugs and planthoppers are increasing in numbers, **so if some are found in large numbers in peas, etc., I would be interested in hearing about it.**
- I am looking for a small black seedbug that looks like a slim lygus bug. I have several years of data on it, and it peaked last year and declined rapidly.
