A word on glyphosate timing in dry beans

From an export perspective, this should not be an issue. Currently, the United States has a maximum residue limit of 5 ppm. The limit in Canada is 2 ppm so we are actually more restrictive than the Americans. To boot, our cargo data shows that we have traditionally had no problem staying well below even this limit in our harvested beans.

The key to keeping well within the MRLs set for the crop is very simple and is two fold;

- Stay at the recommended 1 L/acre rate of the 356 g/L formulations
- Spray only when the crop has reached a point where stems are green to brown, 80 to 90 percent of the leaves have dropped and pods are mature
